THIS DAY IN AVIATION & AEROSPACE HISTORY*

Aug 1, 1943- 178 B-24 bombers fly from Benghazi, Libya, to strike the oil refineries at Ploesti, Romania. 54 bombers were lost, while many others failed to reach safe landings. Over 300 crewmen were killed, 200 taken prisoner, and only 33 aircraft remained flyable. 5 Medals of Honor were awarded, 1500 DFCs in the most highly decorated AF mission of WWII.

Aug 4, 1930 "Speed Queen" Pancho Barnes (famous woman test pilot) set speed record of 196.19 mph.

Aug 26, 1960 World's largest radar construction began at Arecibo, capable of bouncing signals off Venus, Mars and Jupiter.

Aug 29, 1950 Record parachute jump from 42,449 feet.

Aug 30, 1983 STS-8 Challenger crew included the 1st black astronaut, Gulon Bluford, a mission specialist.
